

Adults and Leaders

Adult : Cub Ratio

Whilst we do not wish to discourage adults from coming to CUBJAM to help, we need to ensure that a fair allowance of Adults and Cub attend. Therefore we have set the following guidelines for the Adult : Cub ratio your contingent should bring

- Up to 12 Cubs – Up to 4 leaders
- Up to 24 Cubs – Up to 6 leaders
- Up to 36 Cubs – Up to 8 leaders
- Up to 48 Cubs – Up to 10 leaders
- Up to 60 Cubs – Up to 12 leaders
- Up to 72 Cubs – Up to 14 leaders

This meets POR rule 3.8 which recommends a minimum of 1 Adult to 8 Cubs, plus a leader in charge. These guidelines allow for 1 Adult to 6 Cubs, plus a leader in charge, plus a dedicated cook. If these guidelines are a cause for concern, please contact us to discuss your requirements.

Alcohol / Leaders Bar

There will be NO Leaders Bar at CUBJAM, however there will be a Coffee Shop open from 8am till midnight. (See O2 – CUBJAM Office & Coffee Shop).

Current Scout Association guidelines should be followed regarding Alcohol within your own camping area (see Scoutbase Factsheet 185092).

Adults on Trips

We will allow a maximum of 1 Adult for every 6 Cub Scouts to take part in the trips. This will be based on your contingent numbers – for example if your contingent has 13 Cubs – you will be allowed to send 3 Adults on each trip.

Depending on the trips – it may be possible to pay extra for additional adults. Additional information on this will be published on O1 – Outings when it becomes available.

Cooking / Catering Teams

We expect most contingents to bring a dedicated cook or catering team. These adults are required to pay the FULL Adult fee. The Adult fee does not include any activity or trip costs.

Adults and Leaders

Leaders Children

We understand that Leaders will probably need to bring their younger children.

Children born after 23rd August 2003

There will be NO CHARGE for any leader's child attending that was born after 23rd August 2003 (ie that is under 5¾ at the start of CUBJAM).

However, it may NOT be possible for these children to go on the Outings, or additional costs may apply – this will depend on location of the Outings.

Children born on or before 23rd August 2003

You have the same options as Young Leaders, Explorer Scouts and Scouts*. See "Y1 – Young Leaders, Explorer Scouts and Scouts" for more information.

*The parent will be responsible for ensuring that sufficient insurance is in place for their child to take part in Scouting activities.

Smoking

Smoking will be prohibited in all central and communal areas of the CUBJAM camping and activity fields, and all buildings. Gilwell Park also prohibit smoking at any of the site activities.

As per Scoutbase factsheet FS320005, we ask that anyone who wishes to smoke does so out of sight and away from young people. We also recommend that smoking is not allowed within your contingent camping area as this increases the risk of fire.

Swapping Adults

If you have adults that can only stay for part of CUBJAM, that is not a problem – you can swap adults at any point during the event. All we ask is that you pay for the maximum number of Adults that you have on site at any point of time – this includes everyone aged 18+, including cooking teams, quartermasters etc etc.

What will Adults be required to do at CUBJAM?

- a) Make sure the Cubs have an enjoyable time.
- b) Help to supervise Cubs on CUBJAM Activities.
- c) Work on theme based projects within your Subcamp
- d) Look after your own contingent of Cubs
- e) Cater for your own contingent of Cubs
- f) Run SubCamp activities and bases
- g) Provide the Adult:Cub ratio for the Outings
- h) Drink tea or coffee, relax and ENJOY CUBJAM!!
